Automotive manufacturers in Vaughan are playing a pivotal role by supporting Project Arrow, Canada's first original, full-build, zero-emissions concept vehicle. Major automotive companies from Vaughan, including Arcelor Mittal, Martinrea International, Woodbridge Group and Pfaff Autoworks, have made significant contributions to the project.

The automotive sector in Vaughan makes up a large part of the advanced manufacturing cluster in the city, contributing **\$4 billion** in real gross domestic product to Vaughan's economy in 2022.

You're in good company

Vaughan is home to many globally recognized tier-one suppliers, including Magna International, Martinrea, Multimatic, Hanon Systems, Litens Automotive, IAC and Woodbridge Foam Corporation, as well as numerous tier-two and tier-three suppliers. The city's central location is in direct proximity to assembly plants for giants such as Stellantis, Ford, Honda and Toyota, where businesses can plug into a strong and well-connected supply chain.

Vaughan's emerging business-to-consumer electric vehicle cluster, located at Weston Road and Highway 7 and anchored by Tesla Motors, Rivian Automotive and Lucid Motors, presents significant economic growth opportunities.

Vaughan's automotive sector is comprised of over **660 sector-related businesses** employing more than **13,600 people** and features:

- more than 45 automotive parts manufacturers that employ more than 7,200.
- more than 110 motor vehicle and parts dealers that employ nearly 1,200.
- more than 125 vehicle dealers that employ more than 3,400.

The location quotient* for the automotive sector in Vaughan compared to Canada is 1.93. Vaughan has nearly twice higher concentrations of automotive companies than the national average.

*Location quotient (LQ) is a way of quantifying how concentrated a particular industry, cluster, occupation or demographic group is in a region compared to the nation. It can reveal what makes a particular region unique in comparison to the national average. Many economists consider an area's industry to be concentrated if its LQ is above 1.2.

TAP into a robust and skilled workforce

In 2022, Vaughan was home to nearly **345,000 residents** – that number is expected to increase by 66 per cent by 2051.

Seventy-three per cent of Vaughan's population over 25 years old has a post-secondary certificate, diploma or degree – surpassing both the provincial (68 per cent) and national (67 per cent) average.

Vaughan's location lets you tap into:

- a labour force of 3.9 million workers.
- 12 leading universities and 24 colleges with auto-focused programs, providing a steady pipeline of talent for your company.
